


First Friday Art Walk: Diane Walker's Friday, February 5, 5 - 7 p.m.

Our very popular discussion series Great Decisions at the Library/Library U continues throughout February. Since last month, the community has come together to learn about and weigh in on eight of the most important foreign policy issues facing the United States today. Upcoming topics include: Middle East Alliances (Feb. 6), The United Nations Post-2015 (Feb. 13), The Future of Kurdistan (Feb. 20), and The Politics of Climate Change (Feb. 27). The lively discussions take place from 9:30 to 11 a.m. on Saturday mornings in the Bethany Lutheran Church. All events are free, with donations appreciated. Refreshments are provided.

Now in its eleventh year, Great Decisions at the Library is part of a nation-wide, non-partisan program of the Foreign Policy Association intended to broaden public involvement in foreign affairs. While enjoying coffee and pastries, Great Decisions at the Library participants first view a 30-minute Foreign Policy Association DVD on the topic under consideration and then engage in a discussion lead by an informed moderator.

Refresh, Revitalize, Renovate!

The library will be undergoing some exciting changes this year, including opening and connecting the large meeting room to the main floor. Another area that will undergo some improvements during the refresh project will be the main floor of the library. This will include replacing worn furniture; providing flexible spaces for multiple uses, and soft seating in the Young Adult Area; relocating periodical shelving, the Laptop Bar, carrels, and computer stations; purchasing new moveable shelving for A/V materials and new books; and adding charging stations.

We shared with you last month that the board is able to finance almost three-quarters of the cost of this project from the reserve fund. That leaves a shortfall that they continue to address.
