

Thanks to generous assistance from the Friends of the Library and a world of the graph from Potant, as well as responsible wonderful grant from Rotary, as well as responsible financial caretaking of funds by your library board of directors, this project is almost pre-paid and will start soon. Construction does not mix well with art displays and thus we have suspended our exhibits until the fall when hopefully we can resume in September.

# **BPL Garden Notes By Ann Lovejoy**



Each summer, the library gardens are graced with the white, honeyscented blossoms that deck a number of graceful evergreen trees planted around the grounds. These handsome creatures are Eucryphias, a small family native to Chile, Tasmania, and south-east Australia. At one time, the library had an extensive collection of Eucryphias, but most are fairly tender, as we discovered after several hard winters.

The survivors include two hybrids, Nymansay and Rostrevor, both small, columnar trees that come alive each summer when bees enjoy the large, cupped flowers. A bee-created cross between Tasmanian E. glutinosa AGM and E. lucida that was found in an Irish garden, heavy blooming Rostrevor has smaller leaves and blossoms than Nymansay (which was bred in 1915), which has the showiest flowers in the family. Eucryphias usually bloom from late summer to autumn, but thanks to this year's unusual weather, they are starting early, like so many other plants!

# **Community Conversations**

Kitsap Regional Library will be hosting a series of community conversations across the county this month. Based on a program developed by the American Library Association titled Libraries Transform Communities, each conversation is designed to lead a group to a set of actionable recommendations about community needs. There has been a lot of excitement so far about this initiative among community partners.
